#### IT'S STEWARDSHIP TIME AT CUMC!

Believe it or not, all of that—the worship, service, outreach, and care we offer—is reflected in one document: our Annual Budget. Now, I know what you're thinking: "Budget? Ugh—boring!" But hear me out.

A budget isn't just a list of numbers; it's a statement of faith. I like to think of it as an aspirational plan for the year ahead—a reflection of what we believe God is calling us to do. Pastor Angela calls it a faith document that we must live into. And I can tell you from years of experience, no matter how ambitious our hopes have been, CUMC has always risen to meet them.

By now, you should have received your stewardship packet in the mail. If not, please let me know right away and I'll make sure you get one. Take time to read it carefully, pray over it, and consider how you can respond with your gifts of time, talent, and treasure.

Our goal this year is to fully fund our budget through pledged giving—so that any extra can go directly to expanding mission and ministry. We're asking members to consider increasing their 2025 pledges by 10%. Never pledged before? This is a wonderful time to start!

Whatever you can give—whether in service, skill, or financial support—done prayerfully and with love, is enough. Together, we can continue to be the hands and feet of Christ in our community and beyond.

Our stewardship theme this year is Stepping Up. Colloquially, we use the phrase "stepping up" to talk about rising to a challenge or increasing effort to take on a specific task or responsibility. Literally, we use the phrase "stepping up" to refer to climbing a ladder or staircase. We literally step up, one step at a time. As we age, we find it's unwise to try skipping steps! Metaphorically, we envision a lot of hard tasks as steps—that we also climb one at a time. One foot in front of the other is the only way to get from point A to point B, especially when point B feels far out of reach.



During this stewardship season we are considering how we might step up together to pledge our time, treasure & talents to God and one another as this beloved community called Christ UMC. It's more than checking off a list of what we're willing to do and filling in the blank of what we're willing to give. It's an invitation to step back a moment to think about why it is we do what we do. Yes, it turns out before we can step UP, we've gotta step BACK to see the big picture.

On October 19<sup>th</sup> we celebrated Laity Sunday and were blessed by the reflections by CUMC members on the questions: Why do we follow this Jesus guy anyway? Why do we specifically choose to be United Methodist? And why do we call Christ UMC our church home? I hope these poignant reflections prompted you to ask the same questions of yourself. Why Jesus? Why UM? Why CUMC? Then take that "why"—that motivation, that purpose, that meaning—and ask where you fit into the big picture. How are you called by God to contribute to the mission of our church? What brings you closer to God? What unique gifts do you have that help build up the body? What new way is the Spirit nudging you to do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with God?

The invitation for this stewardship season is to "step up" in your pledged giving by 10%. If you gave \$10 a week in 2025, what if you gave \$11 a week in 2026? If you gave \$500 a month in 2025, what if you give \$550 a month in 2026? If you gave \$4,000 for the year 2025, what if you pledge \$4,400 in 2026? We grow in our giving just like we grow in any other area of life—one step at a time. We have big dreams for our little church and those dreams—that mission, those ministries—require funding and staffing. We will not dramatically change our financial status overnight or in one stewardship season, but how is it that we can stretch—just a little—to help inch us towards our goal of sustainable, growing mission and ministry? I don't extend challenges that I'm not willing to take on myself. So, my family will be the first to sign on to the 10% step up challenge. Will you join us?

Together—one step at a time—we can step up to the challenge of building a sustainable future for Christ UMC!

#### **Upcoming Worship Opportunities**

**November 2nd:** On All Saints Sunday we'll consider the theme Giving Generously as we contemplate the gifts of our spiritual ancestors who have made it possible for us to be who we are today.

**November 9th:** On Pledge Sunday, we'll consider the theme Serving Joyfully as we turn in our Time, Talent & Treasure forms (mailed mid-October also available on side counter) to indicate the ways we are committed to give and serve in 2026.

**November 16th:** The lectionary (assigned reading) text for the day is from the prophet Isaiah about the New Creation. In the midst of the hard realities we face on a daily basis in our families, community, nation and world, how can we stretch our imaginations with Isaiah to imagine the Kin-dom of God?

**November 23<sup>rd</sup>**: We'll celebrate the Festival of the Christian Year! This lessons and carols style service walks through the liturgical seasons for the year. When else can you sing your favorite Christmas carol and favorite Easter hymn on the same Sunday! Join in this fun service and learn about the themes, colors, and meaning of each season.

#### Advent Series: What child IS this?

**November 30<sup>th</sup>- December 21<sup>st</sup>** we'll mark the season of Advent with the tradition of the Advent Wreath and its corresponding themes of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. This year's advent series is called "What child IS this?" asking the question from the beloved carol. This year we'll let this question take us beyond the lullaby into the difficult socio-economic context of the first Advent in Palestine. God's Love made flesh wasn't born just any old time, Jesus was born in the midst of a very specific context that greatly shapes the story itself as well as the theological significance of the incarnation. What child IS this after all? Maybe it's worth re-asking the question.

The series was designed by Dr. Marcia McFee and will incorporate familiar carols into the advent wreath lighting, communion, and even the children's time. Hear what Dr. McFee has to say about the season:

"Advent is usually about waiting. But we cannot wait to have hope; it is essential now. We cannot wait to work for peace; lives are at stake. We cannot wait to embrace joy, even and especially when it seems in short supply. We cannot wait to love, most of all, because we are the ones who follow the saving love of Jesus Christ, God-With-Us."

#### **Immigration Rights: UM Social Principles on Immigration**

We affirm the dignity, worth, and rights of migrants, immigrants, and refugees, including displaced and stateless people. In so doing, we acknowledge that the world today is facing an unprecedented crisis related to the displacement of vast numbers of people due to such factors as ongoing wars and other hostilities, foreign interventions, widespread famine and hunger, global warming and climate change, and the failure of nation-states to adequately protect and care for their people. We recognize that displaced people are particularly vulnerable as their in-between status often provides them with few protections and benefits, leaving them open to exploitation, violence, and abuse.

We urge United Methodists to welcome migrants, refugees, and immigrants into their congregations and to commit themselves to providing concrete support, including help with navigating restrictive and often lengthy immigration policies, and assistance with securing food, housing, education, employment, and other kinds of support.

We oppose all laws and policies that attempt to criminalize, dehumanize, or punish displaced individuals and families based on their status as migrants, immigrants, or refugees. Additionally, we decry attempts to detain displaced people and hold them in inhumane and unsanitary conditions. We challenge policies that call for the separation of families, especially parents and minor children, and we oppose the existence of for-profit detention centers for such purposes.

# Year-End Charitable Giving Consider The Possibilities...

A year end gift now can provide you with a feeling of personal satisfaction and demonstrate your belief in the mission of our church. It may also result in a more tangible return—in the form of desirable tax benefits. Charitable contribution deductions on your current income tax return and capital gains tax savings are two possible benefits. Future estate tax savings may also result from your gift. There are many questions on charitable giving for you to consider before this year draws to a close. They are: When should you give? What should you give?

#### Gifts of Securities

One possibility is a gift of Stock that has grown in value, and you have held for more than one year. This can become a substantial gift, made at a low net cost to you. You still receive a charitable deduction for the donation of these assets, and it's based on their fair market value on the date of the gift. But there's a bonus—you avoid all federal capital gains tax that would otherwise be due on a sale of the assets.
