

For Advent this year, I will be using a worship series "What Child IS This? Beyond the Lullaby" planned by Dr. Marcia McFee, a renowned United Methodist worship planner. The series is shaped around the book *The First Advent in Palestine: Reversals, Resistance & The Ongoing Complexity of Hope* by Kelley Nikondeha. What does it mean to use a worship series? Well, Dr. McFee provides the liturgy and suggestions for worship while I write the sermons to go with it.

Read what Dr. McFee has to say about the series:

"In 1865, William Chatterton Dix penned a poem that would become the beloved Christmas-time favorite, "What Child Is This?" During Advent, we will dive into this question that is much more complicated than the lilting lullaby tune, "Greensleeves," conveys. We will see the story of the time leading up to the birth of Christ in its historical trauma-informed fullness. The story of humanity and its recurring themes of oppression and corruption run right through history and into our own narratives. Yet, we can rely on the assurance of the carol to confirm that God is "present with us" in powerful ways that continue to be the Word of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love even and especially in the midst of hard times."

And this:

"Advent is usually about waiting. But we cannot wait to have hope; it is essential now. We cannot wait to work for peace; lives are at stake. We cannot wait to embrace joy, even and especially when it seems in short supply. We cannot wait to love, most of all, because we are the ones who follow the saving love of Jesus Christ, God-With-Us."

I look forward to journeying together through this Advent season exploring these urgent themes of hope, peace, joy, and love both in the story of Jesus' birth and in our own story in this day and age.

And side note: I'd love to hear what you think of the series as it's trying something new for me so we'll try it out together!

Second Sunday Stock-up on December 14

Before suggestions are given for December's donation request, it is important to express the deepest gratitude for a RECORD donation of 96 pounds of food for the November donations! This was not a contest but highlights the scope of your generosity. This was a bounty of hope and kindness passed along to others, and a profound thank you goes out to you!

The December request fits in with the holidays and the spirit of goodwill, but the food donations take on a more urgent tone with rising food insecurity due to recent events, whether holidays are observed or not. High demand non-perishable foods that can be used to create holiday meals or daily dinners such as canned vegetables, canned yams, canned fruits, instant potatoes, pasta, canned beans, fried onion rings, stuffing, gravy mix are useful. Don't forget canned chicken, beef or pork which can be added to stews and casseroles.

This season is notoriously stressful, and taking some pressure off food insecurity goes a long way in helping remove some pressure for individuals or families.

November 18, 2025 | Making a Difference in the Life of a Child

Everstand (formerly the Board of Child Care) is a comprehensive, multi-faceted regional ministry that seeks to bring healing and wholeness to children and families. While its name changed in 2024, it continues to be a beacon of hope. Each year, Everstand turns to its United Methodist roots, inviting partners in ministry like you to help ensure that every child in its care can experience the joy and wonder of Christmas.

In 1874, Thomas Kelso, at age 93, founded the Kelso Home for Girls in Baltimore, creating an orphanage that became the foundation for what is now the Everstand campus in Randallstown. In 1954, Methodists began the Red Stocking campaign, empowering Methodist children to collect dimes for the orphans. That first year, 60,000 stockings were gathered across Maryland.

Today, Everstand walks alongside youth and families facing tremendously difficult circumstances. Many children and teens have endured emotional, physical, and psychological trauma and carry deep wounds of abandonment and loss. Everstand's mission is to surround them with safety, compassion, and support so that they may experience joy, connection, and a sense of belonging, especially during the holiday season.

Each young person at Everstand thoughtfully creates a holiday wish list, totaling approximately \$150. When you sponsor a wish list, your monetary contribution allows staff to purchase exactly what a child has requested, giving them a tangible reminder that they are seen, valued, and loved. It also gives the gift of autonomy, an intangible that is often absent from the lives of the vulnerable.

CUMC Approves Gift Acceptance and Endowment Policies

On November 20, 2025, D.S Dr. Lanther Mills presided over a special Church Conference for Christ United Methodist Church, where members unanimously approved both a Gift Acceptance Policy and an Endowment Fund Policy.

This decision marks the culmination of work that began earlier in 2025, when the Administrative Board set a goal of establishing an Endowment Fund. The vision was to create a permanent resource where bequests and contributions could be carefully invested, generating income to sustain and expand CUMC's programs, outreach, and ministries for years to come.

The Endowment Fund Policy establishes how gifts are invested, protected, and distributed to support long-term mission and ministry. The Gift Acceptance Policy provides clear guidelines for the types of donations the church may receive and how they will be managed.

The Endowment Fund offers members and friends an additional way to make charitable gifts. Combined in a permanent endowment, these contributions serve as a living memorial while supporting a wide range of mission and outreach projects that advance CUMC's core principles of love, justice, and community.

By design, the principal of the endowment remains intact, while a percentage of the investment earnings is used to support ministry and mission outreach not covered by the annual operating budget, while also supplementing existing programs and ministries. A small percentage of the investment interest earnings will be used annually to support a broad variety of activities and projects related to mission and outreach.

Our 2026 Endowment Fund kickoff will share educational insights and invite everyone to help build the future while establishing a personal legacy. Stayed tuned for more details in 2026.
